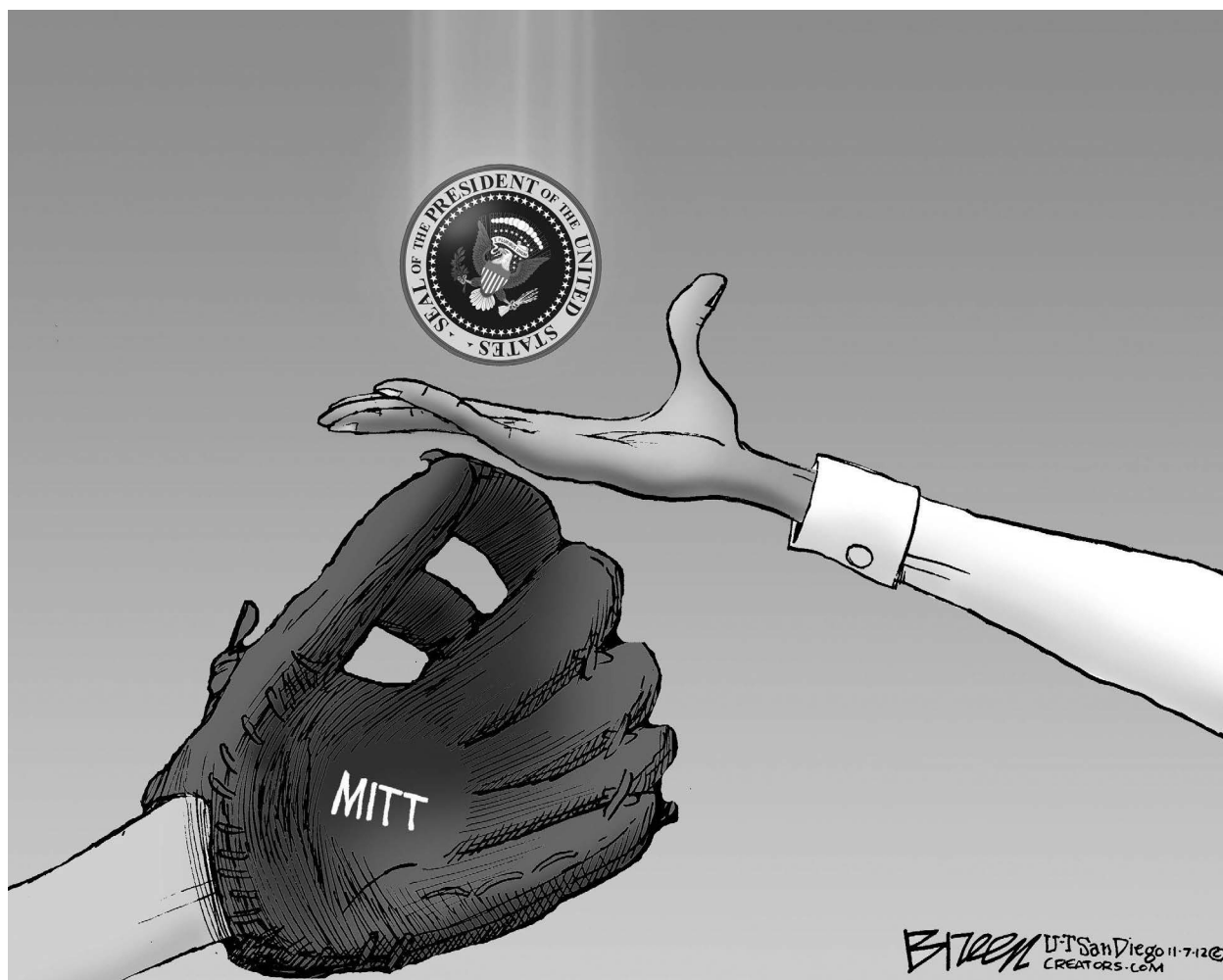


STEVE SACK

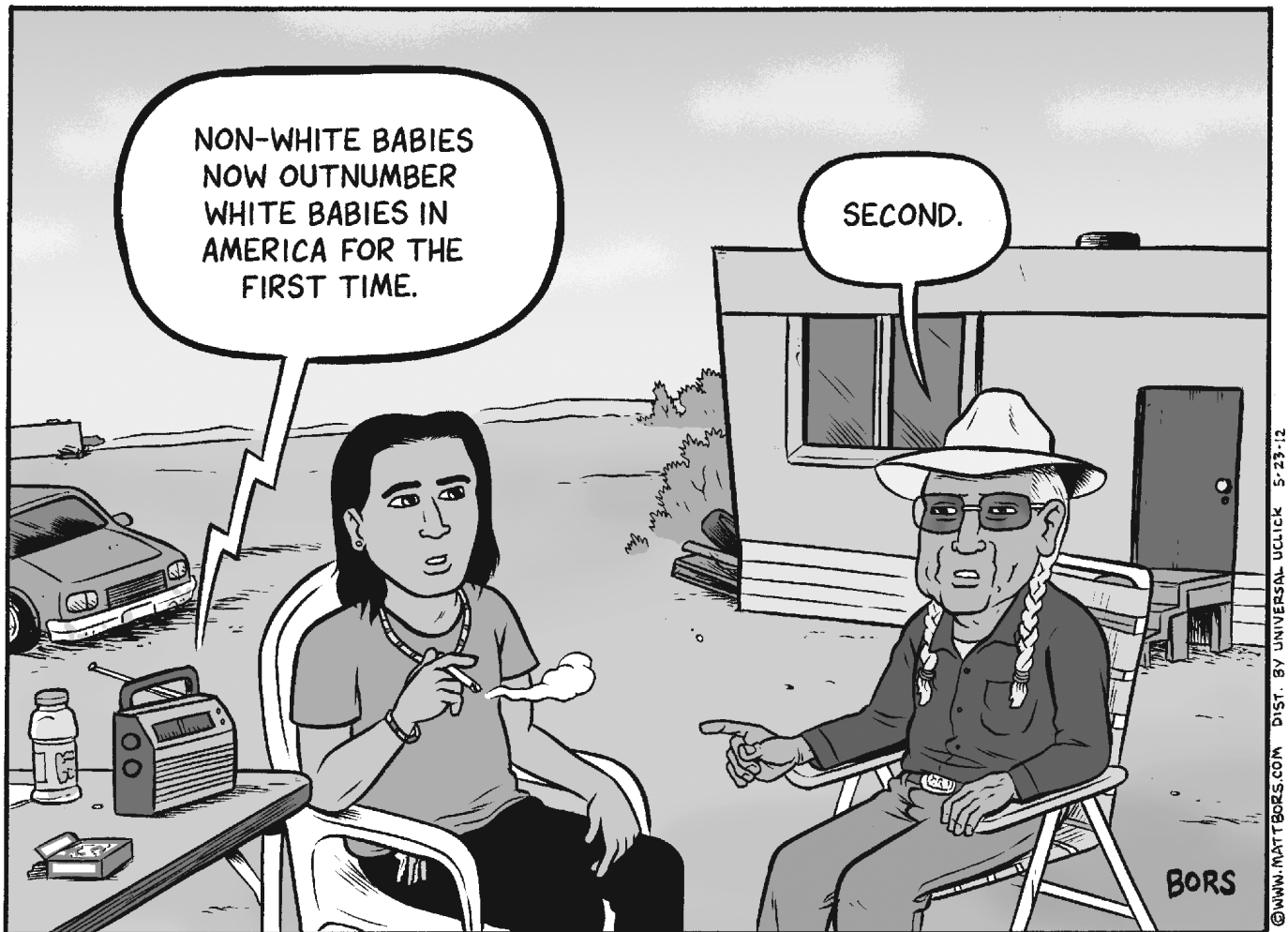


STEVE BREEN

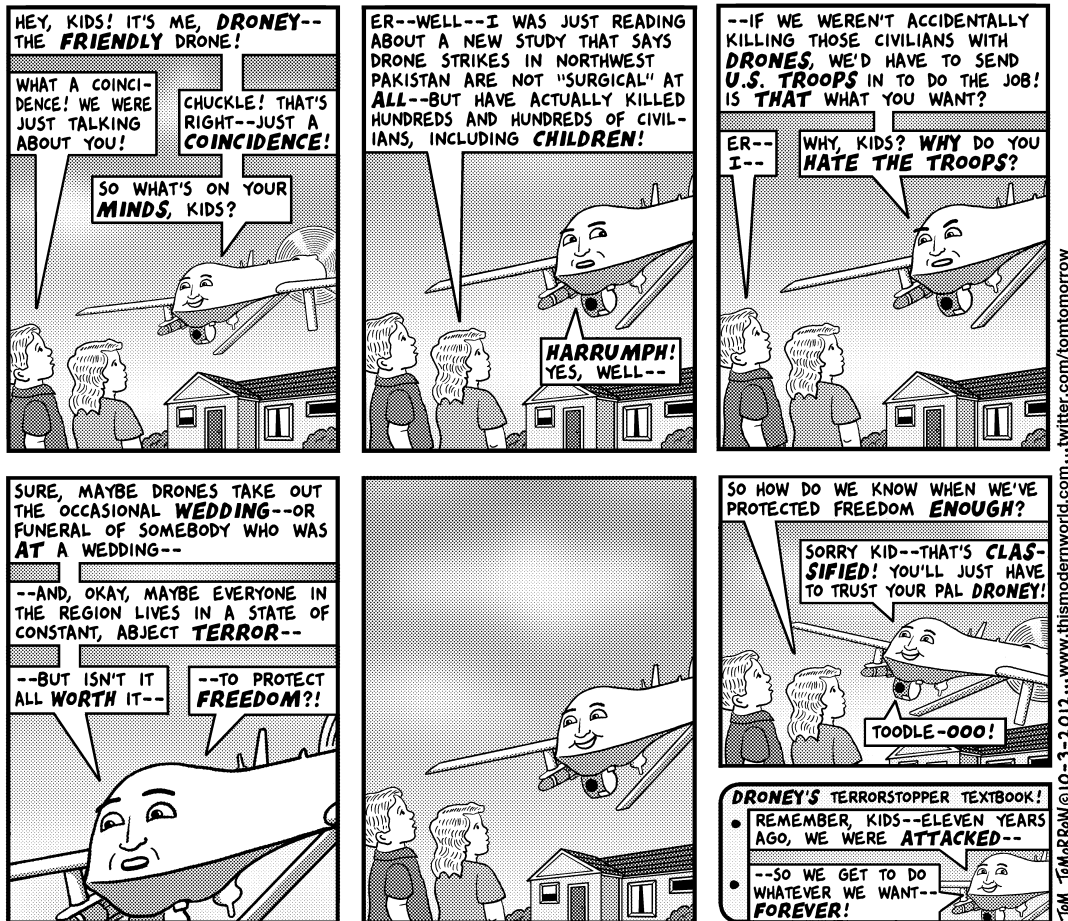

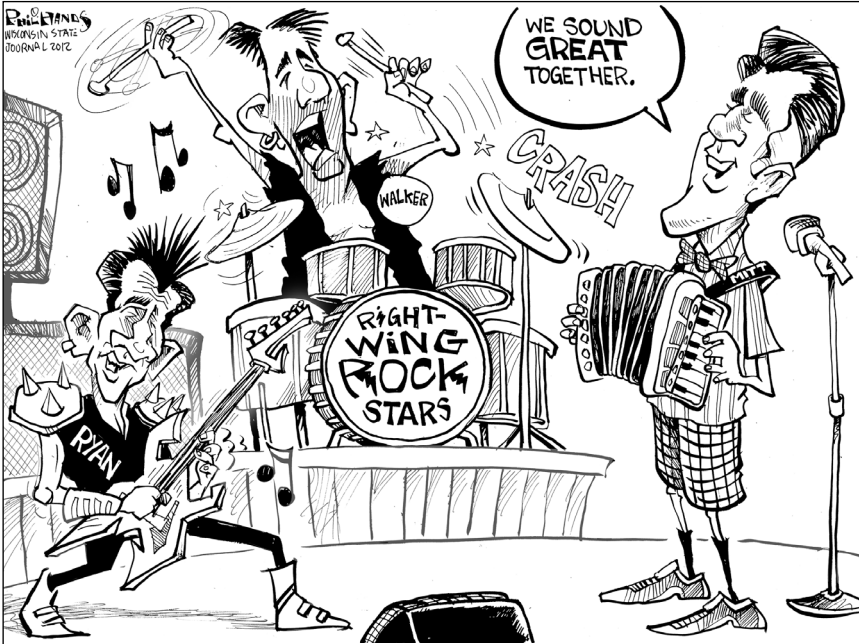
