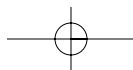
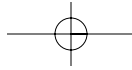

HERALDING ANGELS

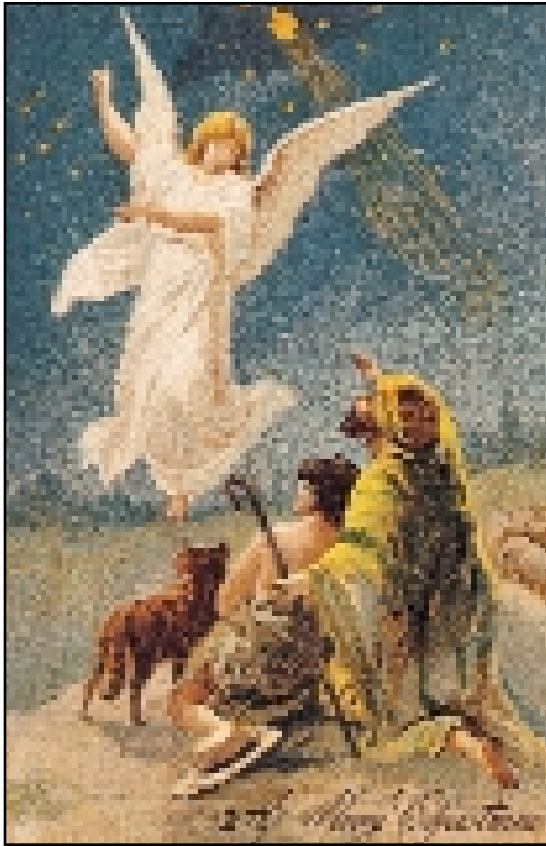
It was the heralding angels that came to tell the shepherds about the “Newborn King.”
