

In 1915, writer and artist Johnny Gruelle created a rag doll called Raggedy Ann, which was introduced in 1918. The commercial success of Raggedy Ann and the antics of Gruelle's two young sons, Worth and Dickie, helped convince Gruelle that Raggedy Ann needed a little brother. In late 1920, Raggedy Andy met his public as a huggable doll and was introduced in his own book of tales called Raggedy Andy Stories.
